CHARTER ORDINANCE NO. 14-01

NOTICE OF PRIMARY ELECTION

A CHARTER ORDINANCE EXEMPTING THE CITY OF BIRD CITY, KANSAS FROM THE PROVISIONS OF K.S.A. 12-1222 RELATING TO THE REQUIREMENT THAT MEMBERS OF THE MUNICIPAL LIBRARY BOARD BE RESIDENTS OF THE MUNICIPALITY.

I, the undersigned County Clerk, hereby give notice that a Primary Election will be held on August 5, 2014, this being the first Tuesday of said month, at which time candidates for the following offices will be nominated according to the provisions of law by EACH of the political parties of this state who qualify to participate in said Primary Election as specified by law:

- The portion of K.S.A. 12-1222 requiring members of a municipal library board to be residents of the municipality shall not apply to the City of Bird City.
- Prospective board members who are not residents of the City of Bird City, Kansas may be considered in the same manner as those prospective members who reside within the city of Bird City, Kansas, provided the prospective board member resides in Cheyenne County, Kansas and resides within the U.S.D. 103.
- Membership of the Library Board for the City of Bird City, Kansas shall be made up of seven members, no less than five of which shall be residents of the City of Bird City, and no more than two of which may be chosen from persons residing outside the City of Bird City, Kansas. Nothing shall prevent membership of the library board to consist of more than the minimum number of residents of the City of Bird City as provided herein, but in no event shall members chosen from those persons residing outside the City of Bird City exceed the number provided herein.

- One candidate for United States Senate.
- One candidate for United States Representative 1st District.
- One pair of candidates for Governor/Lieutenant Governor.
- One candidate for Secretary of State.
- One candidate for Attorney General.
- One candidate for State Treasurer.
- One candidate for Commissioner of Insurance.
- One candidate for State Representative 120th District.
- One candidate for Member, State Board of Education 5th District.
- One candidate for County Commissioner 1st District.
- One candidate for Township Clerk for Benkelman Township.
- One candidate for Township Clerk for Bird City Township.
- One candidate for Township Clerk for Calhoun Township.
- One candidate for Township Clerk for Cleveland Run Township.
- One candidate for Township Clerk for Jaqua Township.
- One candidate for Township Clerk for Orlando Township.
- One candidate for Township Clerk for Wano I Township.
- One candidate for Township Clerk for Wano II Township.
