

## Changes in drought relief Payment rates will be as fol-

ers would be left out of a new drought assistance measure moving through Congress, U.S. Senator Pat Roberts late Tuesday finished negotiations on a new Senate Agriculture Committee drought relief package that will bring real, targeted assistance to those suffering from drought con-

"I am confident that this compromise is the best proposal for all of our producers. Directing payments only to areas and producers that have suffered crop losses is great news for Kansas livestock producers," Senator Roberts said. "By taking out eligibility for producers that did not suffer losses, approximately \$250 million in savings were provided that can now be used for assistance to livestock producers."

Assistance for livestock producers will be provided through the Livestock Assistance Program, Roberts said. Any funds received for the Livestock Compen-

Concerned that Kansas produc-sation Program (LCP) last fall will be subtracted out before a producer receives additional payments. However, almost all producers that received LCP assistance should qualify for additional assistance under this pro-

"In addition," Roberts said, "my legislation to waive the 25 percent reduction in Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) rental rates for producers that used their own CRP ground for emergency haying and grazing last summer and fall is included in this new

The new proposal also allows I would work for real assistance producers in counties designated as a primary disaster area in 2001 or 2002 (all Kansas counties) and producers with losses of 35 percent or greater in non-primary counties, to get an additional direct payment on their crop bases. Producers will be able to use their historical base and yield for direct payments under either the 1996 Farm Bill or the 2002 Farm Bill.

The Cheyenne Co. Conservation District announces signup for the Water Resources Cost-Share Program and the Non-Point Source Pollution Cost-Share Program. Applications will be taken at the Conservation Office, January 21 - 31.

The following practices are eligible for cost-share assistance: Diversions, Cross-Fencing, Field and Feedlot Windbreaks, Irrigation Water Conveyance Pipeline, Livestock Pipelines, Wells and Tanks, Spring Developments, Terraces, Range Seeding, Sprinkler Irrigation Systems Upgrades, Livestock Waste Control Facilities, Abandoned Well Plugging and Septic System Upgrades.

Cost-share assistance rate is 50-70%. All applications will be reviewed and ranked by the District Board of Supervisors and funded according to priorities recommended by the Kansas Water Plan. Work may not be started until notified by the Conservation District Board. Deadline to complete work is May 31.
