

Meth workshop scheduled April 23

Sheriff Eddie Dankenbring has arranged for a Meth Awareness Workshop to be held on April 23 in Cheyenne County. The first workshop will be held at 9 a.m. at the Cheylin High School in Bird City. At 1 p.m., the workshop will be held at the St. Francis Community High School. Both programs held during the day will target students seventh grade through 12th grades.

That evening from 7:30 to 9:30, the workshop will be open to the public in the St. Francis high school auditorium. The following day, the program will be held in Atwood.

"The workshop may be of particular interest not only to law enforcement, firefighters and emergency medical service personnel but also to anyone who is in con-

tact with the public, sells products which could be used in meth productions, travels in rural areas, makes home visits or check meters, crops or roads in north-west Kansas," Sheriff Dankenbring said, noting that the general public interested in learning more about meth and how to spot a meth user.

The workshops are sponsored through the sheriff's office and the county health office through the Kids Making A Difference program.

The workshop will be taught by Christy Cann, coordinator for Meth Awareness for the State of Kansas.
