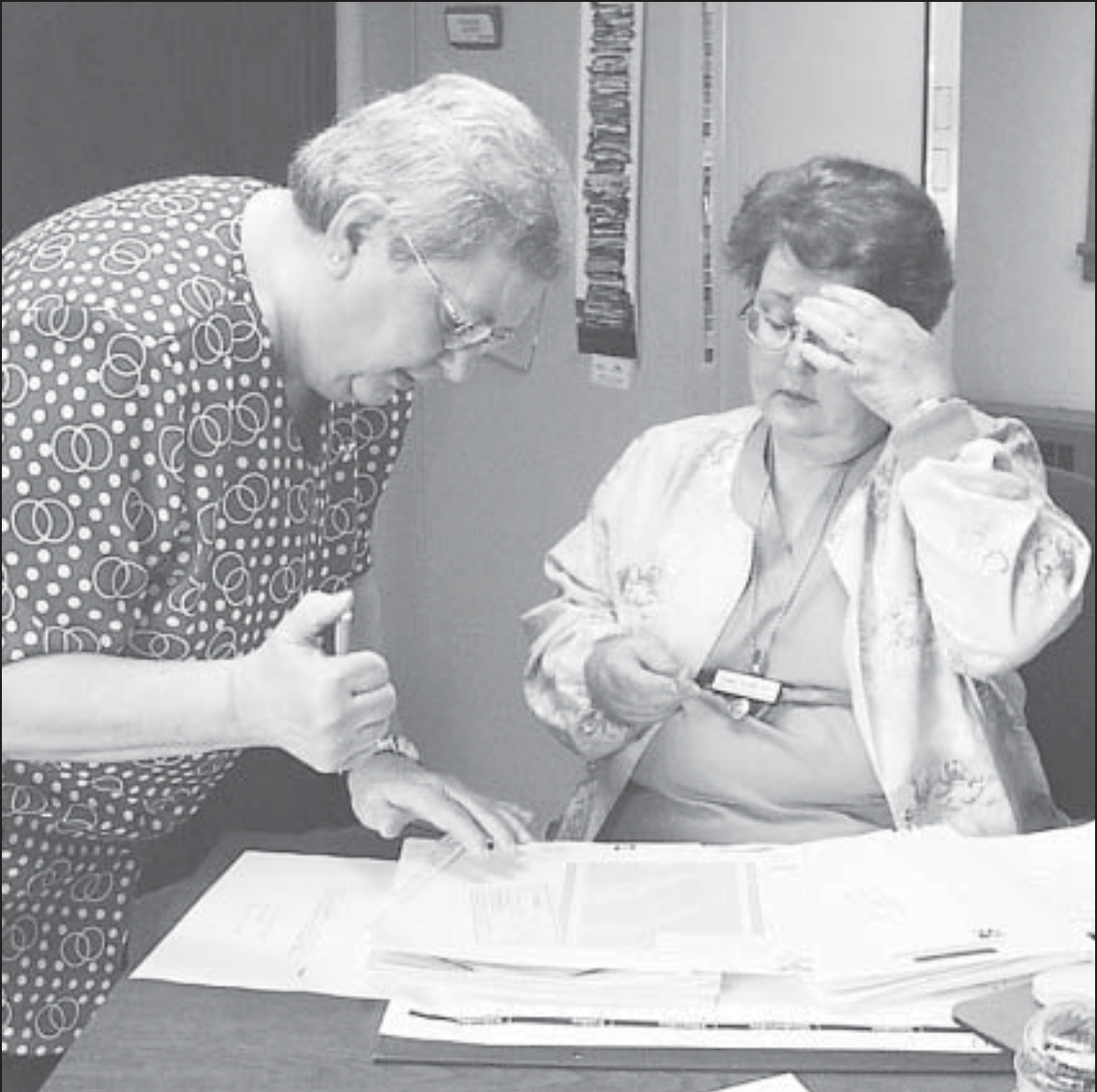

Health department receives money to purchase charts

The Cheyenne County Health Department recently received a check for \$50 from the Kansas West District Dietary Managers Association. The money will be used to purchase graphic charts for determining the ideal body weight for height and weight; and stature-forage and weight for age percentiles in boys

and girls. "We were happy to receive this funding so we could purchase these charts," said Susan Roelfs, county health nurse. "We will use them to help teach children and their parents more about what they should weigh." Vivian Appelhams, dietitian manager at Hoxie, presented the check.

All the counties in the association received \$50.

Dietary Managers Association is a national not-for-profit association established in 1960 and has professionals dedicated to the mission of providing optimum nutrition care through food service management. Members of the association are trained in foodservice operations management and have taken a certification exam.

The major emphasis of the association is education and continuing education. Each certified member must obtain 45 hours of continuing education (40 education and 5 safety), over a three-year period.

Cheyenne County is one of 53 counties included in the Kansas West District Dietary Managers Association.

Virus detected in over 16,000 wild birds tested nationwide

In 2002, West Nile Virus was detected in over 16,000 birds tested nationwide.

Blue jays and crows are the most commonly affected but over 175 species of birds have been infected.

The public plays an important role in monitoring West Nile Virus through reporting dead birds to state and local health departments. By taking surveillance of the dead birds, this may be the best way to detect the presence of the virus in new regions. Kansas State Public

Veterinarian Dr. Gail Hansen said they knew migratory birds could spread the virus.

"Kansas has been conducting ongoing surveillance and will continue to monitor its occurrence and provide public health information," Dr. Hansen said. "We really encourage citizens to help us in this effort."

To report a dead bird, call the Kansas toll free hotline 1-866-452-7810. This hotline includes detailed instructions on which birds will be tested and how to arrange for pick

up. Not all reported dead birds will be picked up or tested. Dead birds can also be reported using the University of Kansas Natural History Museum form at www.mnh.ku.edu/birds. Results of testing dead birds will be available at the website, but test results or reports on specific birds collected will not be given out.

Horses may be more at risk for virus than humans

Horses may be more at risk when it comes to contacting West Nile Virus than humans. About one-third of horses that are infected with the virus will die or need to be killed. However, most horses recover from the infection. There is no reason to kill a horse just because it has been infected with West Nile Virus.

West Nile Virus multiplies in the horse's blood system, crosses the blood barrier and infects the brain. The virus interferes with normal central nervous system functioning and causes inflammation of the brain. Many times West Nile Virus symptoms can be confused with rabies and other diseases.

Some of the symptoms include: stumbling or tripping, muscle weakness, partial paralysis, loss of appetite, depression, impaired vision, inability to swallow, inability to stand up, fever, convulsions, and coma. If horse owner sees any of these symptoms in their horse, it is recommended that they contact their veterinarian immediately.

According to Dr. Gail Hansen, Kansas State Public Health Veterinarian, the virus cannot be spread from horses to humans.

"In reality, West Nile Virus is usually a mild disease in humans," he said. "Unfortunately, that message doesn't always get communicated. People cannot get the disease from horses or from the birds that

carry the virus."

There is no specific treatment for the virus, but it is recommended that horses receive the West Nile Virus vaccine. The most effective way to prevent the spread of West Nile Virus in horses is to control mosquito populations. By keeping horses stabled during dawn and dusk, keeping lights off that attract insects, eliminating stagnant water and puddles, and cleaning water troughs weekly, this will help keep your animals safe.

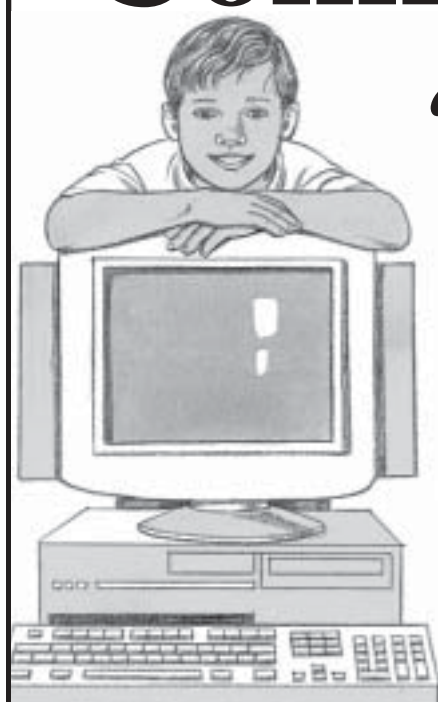
