

Virus detected in over 16,000 wild birds tested nationwide

In 2002. West Nile Virus was detected in over 16,000 birds tested nationwide.

Blue jays and crows are the most commonly affected but over 175 species of birds have been infected.

The public plays an important role in monitoring West Nile Virus through reporting dead birds to state and local health departments. By taking surveillance of the dead birds, this may be the best way to detect the presence of the virus in instructions on which birds will be www.oxnet.ksu.edu/
