Kansas identifies four resource concerns to address

"The objective of Environmental **Quality Incentives Program is to** address natural resource concerns through the application of improved conservation systems" said Mr. Klaege.

Environmental Quality Incentives Program, one of the largest programs in the Farm Bill, is a voluntary conservation program that promotes environmental quality and assists producers to meet local, state and federal regulations.

In Kansas, Environmental Quality Incentives Program funds will help farmers and ranchers install conservation practices that improve and protect Kansas's four natural resources concerns.

They are: Air Quality addressing odors due to livestock concerns; Grazing Lands Health; Soil Quality addressing Excessive Wind Erosion; Water Quality addressing Confined Animal Waste; Concentrated, Non-confined Animal Waste; Nutrients, Pesticides, and Sedimentation; and Water Quantity Addressing Ground and Surface Water Consrvation.

### **Environmental Quality Incen**tives Program addresses drought impacted Natural Resource concerns
