The Cheyenne County Amusement Authority has spent months working on and painting new and old equipment, painting fences and booths as well as just fixing up and getting ready — just part of the commitment they make as Amusement Authority members.

Now just three weeks until the fair, the carnival crew is hustling. The prizes for games have been ordered, most of the fences are painted and the newest ride, a second Octopus, is almost ready.

"We'll have it ready to go by fair

time," said Greg Walz, Authority member.

Bill Ehrman, Marvin Confer and Sam Miller were busy measuring what would be needed to rebuild the seats and the safety chains will be welded on before the ride is ready for use.

"We don't take any chances," Mr. Walz said.

Mr. Ehrman is also talking about getting the equipment greased, an important element in keeping the equipment running smoothly during the fair and hold it through un-

til next year.

The new ride was purchased from Norton and the men working on the project reported that it needed greasing when they got it but after spending an entire evening power washing the ride so it could be painted, it really needed grease.

The Authority decided to purchase the second Octopus ride because it is the most popular ride at the fair. Often the lines would get pretty long during busy times. One ride will have cooling water splashes allowed where the other

will not.

The home-owned carnival is one of the better carnivals in the area and kids can still ride for 25 cents (kiddie rides) and 50 cents for the adult rides. The length of each ride is long and well worth any cost.
