Harvey A. Black

April 11, 1918 - Aug. 18, 2003
Harvey A. Black, 85, died Monday, Aug. 18, 2003, at his home in rural McDonald, Kan. He was born April 11, 1918, at Alva, Okla., to Earl E. and Elizabeth (Breford) Black.

On Jan. 30, 1948, he was united in marriage to Frieda S. Antholz at Denver, Colo.

Mr. Black was a farmer and custom harvester. He had lived on a farm 2 1/2 miles north of McDonald since 1950, moving from Colorado. He served in the 41st Division of

the United States Army from October, 1941, to November, 1945, and served under General Douglas MacArthur while in the Pacific.

Memberships included St. John Lutheran Church of Bird City; Chester Phipps American Legion 229 of McDonald and B.P.O.E. 1528 of Goodland.

Preceding him in death were his parents; a brother Ernest Black, and two sisters Mary Decker and Mildred Morland.

Survivors are his wife Frieda of McDonald; son Gregory Allen Black and wife, Jillene McMinn

Black of Windsor, Colo.; daughter Noell Alane Hubbard and husband, Greg of Smith Center; six grandchildren, Breeann, Kaitlin, Gabariel, Michael, Landon and Kami.

Funeral services were held Thursday, Aug. 21, at St. John Lutheran Church in Bird City with Pastors Ron Roberts and Clayton Nietfeld officiating.

Interment was in the Grace Cemetery in McDonald.

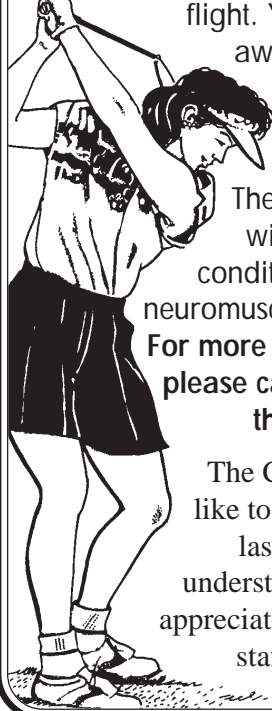
