

The "In a state where over 97-percent Natural Resources Conservation Service then provides the application to a Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks biologist who would then work with the landvider. Technical assistance includes conservation planning, and/ or design, layout, installation, and checkout of approved conservation practices

The Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program is a voluntary program for people who want to develop and improve wildlife habitat primarily on private land. Through Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program, Natural Resources Conservation Service provides both technical assistance and up to 75 percent cost-share assistance to establish and improve fish and wildlife habitat. Wildlife Habitat Incentives Program agree-Conservation Service and the participant generally last from 5 to 10 years from the date the agreement is signed.
