She was born Jan. 21, 1915, in Idaho Springs, Colo., to Earl and Clara White. She came with her parents to Chase County, Neb., in 1917. She attended rural grade school southwest of Champion, Neb., and graduated from Chase County High School in 1932.

On July 5, 1932, she married Kenneth Brown and for the next two years they farmed in the Chase County area. In the spring of 1934, they moved to make their home on a farm north of Parks, where they spent all of their married life. To this union three children were born, daughters Carol and Velda and son Dan.

After the children were raised, Idella began working in Benkelman, Neb. She worked at the Dundy County Hospital for about two years as a nurses aide. Then in 1965, she started working as deputy treasurer in Dundy County, a job she held until she retired in 1977.
