Several students receive scholarships

Hayley Young of Cheylin High School and Amber Fromholtz of St. Francis High School are among 178 high school seniors from 64 north-west Kansas high schools who have received scholarships from the Dane G. Hansen Foundation of Logan. This is the 30th annual scholarship competition.

In addition, 10 scholarships have been awarded to Kansas Community College graduates of the current school year and Jamie Dunn of St. Francis has received one of these.

Young has received one of eight Hansen Leader of Tomorrow scholarships. These awards are for \$5,000 renewable for three additional years, provided the student

maintains a satisfactory academic record.

Fromholtz is one of 81 students interested in vocational training who has received a one-year award of \$1,500.

Ten Community College scholarships were made available to Kansas Community College graduates of the current school year who plan to continue their education at a four-year Kansas college or university. These awards are for \$2,000 and may be renewed for one year upon completion of satisfactory work as evaluated by the Scholarship Committee. Dunn will be able to take advantage of this scholarship.

The Hansen Foundation also named 30 Hansen Scholars who received \$3,000 for one year and have the opportunity to have it renewed for one additional year and 60 Hansen Student awards of \$2,000 each.
