Some Kansas hunter education requirements will change in 2005. Effective Jan. 1, hunters 15 years and younger may hunt without hunter education certification, provided they are under the direct supervision of an adult 18 or older.

The new law, approved by the 2004 Kansas Legislature, contains these additional provisions:

• No child under the age of 11 will be certified in hunter education although they may be able to attend hunter education courses if space is

• No one under age 12 may hunt unless accompanied by an adult,
