



# Cancer society opens process for fifth scholarship program

The Heartland Division of the American Cancer Society announces the opening of the application process for the fifth year of the Young Cancer survivors' Scholarship Program. During the first four years of the program, the Heartland Division awarded a total of 272 scholarships for \$1,000 each to bright enthusiastic, young cancer

survivors within the four states of the Division. The completed applications must be returned to the Division office by early April (the postmark deadline is April 4). Notification will be given to the renewed and new awardees in July. While they do not guarantee their scholarship will be renewed, ap-

plicants who received a scholarship last year can reapply for one this year. Here are the current eligibility criteria for the Young Cancer Survivors' Scholarship Program.

- Have a diagnosis of cancer before the age of 21
- Be a legal resident of Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska or Oklahoma
- Be a high school senior, or, if already in college, have a grade point average of 2.0, based on a 4.0 scale
- Accepted to an accredited university, college, community college, or vocational technical school
- Be 25 years or younger at the time of application.

## Wrestler captures championship

Alex Thomas fulfilled a major goal on Jan. 14 and 15 as he captured the championship of the 50th annual Cliff Keen Tulsa Nationals wrestling tournament. Generally known as the "toughest tournament in the world," and billed as the "Real National Championships," this year's tournament featured over 3,000 wrestlers from 40 states. On his way to the championship, Alex had two pins and defeated Alex Burkle of Iowa 8-5 in an exciting match. Burkle's record was 30-0 coming into the match. The legendary Danny Hodge was

the presenter at the awards ceremony, and Alex is shown receiving his trophy from him. Mr. Hodge was an undefeated three-time National Collegiate Athletic Association champion at the University of Oklahoma, an Olympic medalist, and a teammate of Dick Delgado. Many will remember Mr. Delgado, a two-time National Collegiate Athletic Association champ and Olympic placer, who was wrestling coach at Atwood Community High School in the 1960s. Dan Thomas, Alex's father, wrestled under him.

## County Health News

### Immunize and Win a Prize

The Cheyenne County Health Office staff is encouraging all parents to immunize their children by offering prizes. "Each time you bring in your child for an immunization, you'll receive a different item including Children's Tylenol, Bee Wise sticker, digital thermometer or a Beanie Bee," Nurse Susan Roelfs said. "For each child that completes the primary series, (4-3-1-3-3-1) during the program, you'll be entered into a grand prize drawing to be held in September."

The grand prize is four days and five nights at Walt Disney World and includes airfare, meals and lodging. There are 12 other weekend vacations in Wichita and winners will be treated to the Sedgwick County Zoo, will have hotel accommodations, meals, transportation and zoo tickets. Each county will receive three prizes: 1) \$500 toward the owner's rent; 2) 30 hours of long distance calls; and \$500 toward the utility bill of the winner's choice: gas, water or electricity.

"Your child must complete his or her immunization series for your family to win," Nurse Roelfs said. All children, ages birth to 24-months, need immunizations to prevent future illness. Children have until Sept. 16 to be immunized and receive free gifts. Nurse Roelfs noted that the contest prizes are provided with Tobacco Settlement Monday, the Center for Disease Control and in-kind partnership donations by McNeil Pharmaceuticals and Birch Telecom. There is no cost to the provider or the families.
