





'Each time you bring in your child for an immunization, you'll receive a different item including Children's Tylenol, Bee Wise sticker, digital thermometer or a Beanie Bee," Nurse Susan Roelfs "For each child that completes

the primary series, (4-3-1-3-3-1) during the program, you'll be entered into a grand prize drawing to be held in September."

The grand prize is four days and five nights at Walt Disney World and includes airfair, meals and lodging.
