

## **Final hearing held** for fire truck grant

The public hearing concerning the fire truck grant was held at 9 a.m. during the Cheyenne County Commissioners' meeting on Friday. Only a handful of people including Don Spangler, representative of Weis Fire and Safety, were in the room when the hearing was held.

The hearing was held as a recommendation by the grant administrator Amy Griffey because the fire chief George Harper was an employee of Yost Farm Supply. The Hay Fire Equipment company, in its bid, noted that it had planned to purchase the trucks from Yost Ford-Mercury. Even though the Yost company that Mr. Harper works for is a separate company from Yost Ford-Mercury, Ms. Griffey said it was important that the hearing be held so everyone could voice their opinions. There were no complaints heard.

Another reason for the hearing was the fact that the commissioners, had not taken the low bid of They will select the best value to


