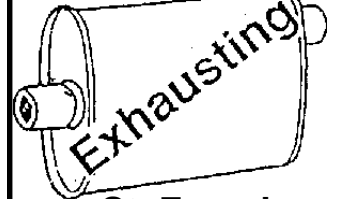

FRANCIS, KANSAS; INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE "UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE FOR KANSAS CITIES," EDITION OF 2005, AMENDING SECTION 101 OF ARTICLE 11 OF THE 2003 CODE OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 523.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS, that Ordinance No. 523 be repealed and that Section 101 of Article 11 of the 2003 Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas and entitled "INCORPORATING UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE" is hereby amended to read as follows: 11-101 INCORPORATING UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE.

There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating public offenses within the corporate limits of the City of St. Francis, Kansas, that certain code known as the "Uniform Public Offense Code," Edition of 2005, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. FRANCIS, KANSAS AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 524.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ST. FRANCIS, KANSAS, that Ordinance No. 524 be repealed and that Section 101 of Article 14 of the 2003 Code of the City of St. Francis, Kansas, and entitled "INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE" is hereby amended to read as follows: 14-101 INCORPORATING STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE. There is hereby incorporated by reference for the purpose of regulating traffic within the corporate limits of the City of St. Francis, Kansas, that certain standard traf-

fic ordinance known as the "Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities," Edition of 2005, prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas. No fewer than three copies of said Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be marked or stamped "Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 531," and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the city clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable hours.
