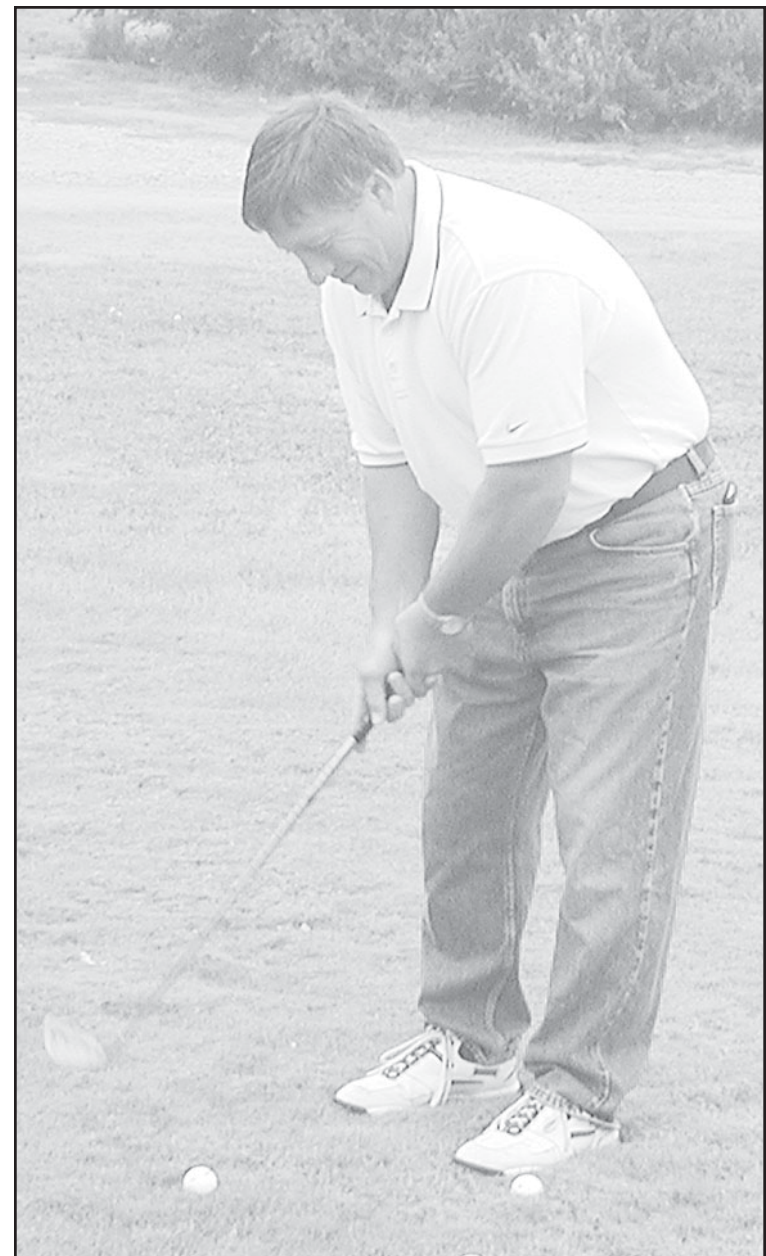

City of St. Francis will hold public meeting for grant

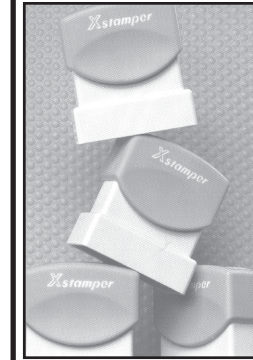
