"Pictures are more than a piece of paper with a face," she said.

"Actually, no one can make a back drop (outside) like God can," she said.

Mrs. Morrow is available to take senior, family and children photos along with wedding photos. She has taken photos of special events such as a baby shower which are compiled into an album. She enjoys taking photos of landscapes and has several for sale.

She sees the new business as an opportunity to keep in contact with those she has worked with on the volleyball team and with voice lessons. She is also looking forward to meeting and working with other people.

"I'm excited. It (photography) is a creative outlet," she said.
