"I appreciate all the time that others will invest in this training," she said. "I am committed to do my best to 'pass it on.'"

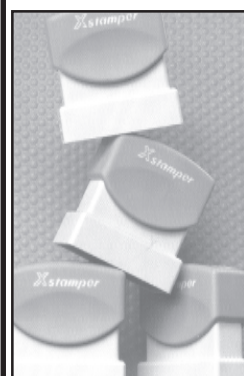


CONNIE MORRIS, the new administrator in training, talks to Janet Siegfried, director of nurses, about a patient matter. Herald staff photo by Karen Krien
