Couple set plans for marriage Sept. 1

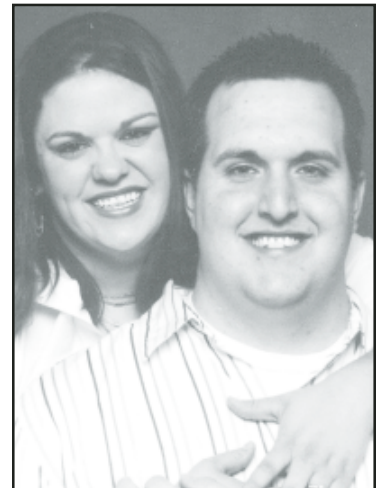
Tara Brooke Neitzel of St. Francis and John Simmonds of McDonald plan to be married on Sept. 1.
