Drive-in theaters began sprouting up in towns across the plains in the years following World War II. In 1958 there were at least 125 drive-ins in Kansas. That year would mark the height of outdoor movie viewing.

Today there are 13 theaters listed on the www.driveintheater.com website. About 80 "Dead Drive-Ins" are also on the site.






