Dr. Miller came to practice in the county eight years ago. She said that she did not come because the hospital was a great facility but she saw there was a need for a physician and she and her husband wanted to raise their family in this community and send their children to school in St. Francis.

With tears in her eyes, she commended the board and past boards on their foresight.

"When I came, the Bird City Clinic was a room in the Kitten Mall and the clinic in St. Francis was a cramped facility," she said.

She said the board has done so much for the communities and the hospital, from building a clinic in Bird City to remodeling the St. Francis clinic; and, not only remodeling but expanding, onto the hospital.
