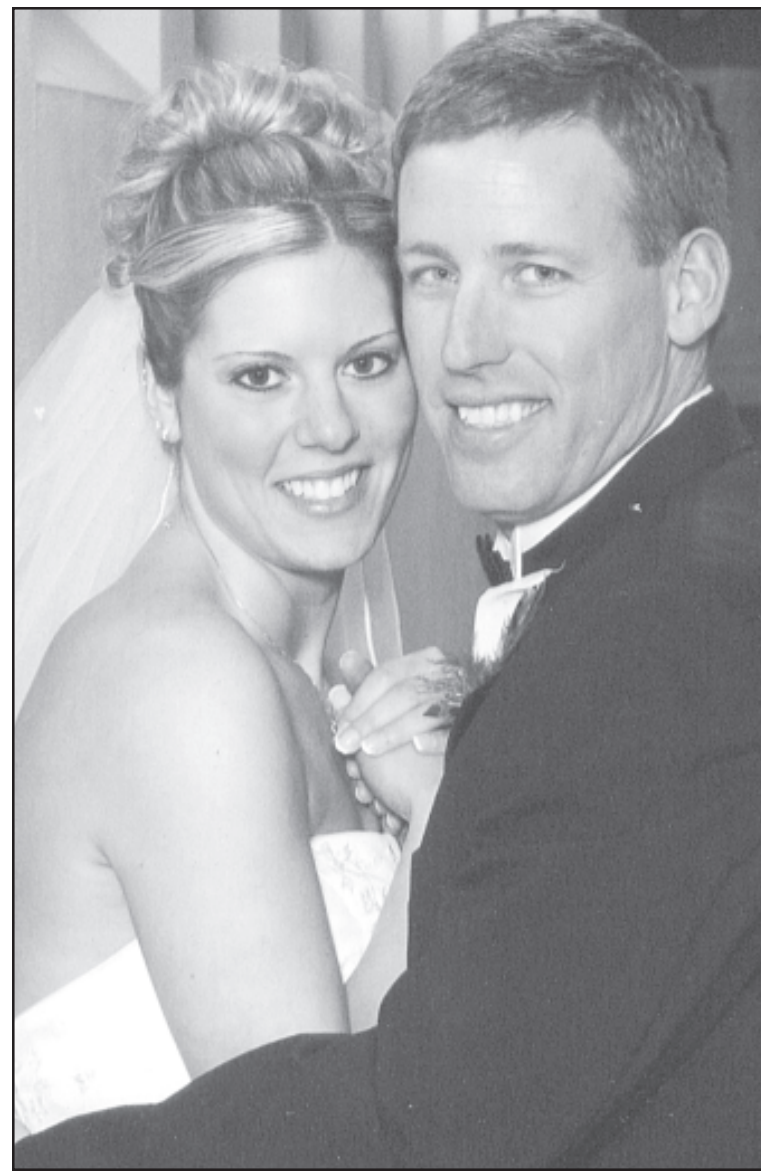
Ushers were Ivan Phillips, Adam Phillips, Dale Niblock and Paul Niblock.

# Helpful hints

Kids don't come with instructions! Rearing children can be a challenge, and many parents have little information about effective, positive discipline methods. Here are a few tips from Kansas Children's Service League:

- Use "time out" to discipline young children. Time out means having a child sit in a special "time out" chair for a few minutes. One minute for every year of the child's age is the guideline.

- Discipline older children by removing a privilege, such as watching television or going to a friend's house.

- Establish rules and make sure your child understands what the rules are, why the rules exist, and what the consequences will be. As your child grows up and is able to handle more freedom and responsibility, reassess the rules and adjust them.

- Don't hit or yell at a child in anger. If you feel out of control, go to another room and calm down. Think about constructive ways to solve the problem.

- If you are concerned about your child's behavior or mental health, seek counseling. Some counseling programs are low-cost or free of charge. Your child is worth it.

- If you have questions, call the Parent Helpline. The Helpline is available 24 hours every day to help answer parenting questions and relieve stress. The number in Wichita is 263-5437. Outside Wichita, the toll-free number is 1-800-332-6378. Callers can remain anonymous. The Helpline is a service of Kansas Children's Service League, a private, nonprofit agency dedicated to children and families. KCSL is an affiliate of the National Committee to Prevent Child Abuse. The Parent Helpline is funded in part by federal funds granted through the Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services (SRS).

## Extension Notes

### High humidity can be a real 'drag'

The phrase is used over and over again - "it's not the heat, it's the humidity." But what exactly does that mean?

Relative humidity actually is a relative measure, said Mary Knapp, State of Kansas climatologist. The amount means it varies with the temperature.

This elusive value, however, can be a day-to-day concern. Relative humidity can affect humans' mood and well-being.

"The effects are worst when it's high or low," Ms. Knapp said. "All relative humidity is, though, is the amount of air-borne water vapor needed to reach the saturation point - in other words, to condense and become rain, snow or fog.

"The warmer the temperature is, the more moisture the condensing

process requires. During summer, 50 percent relative humidity means a whole lot more water than it does in the winter."

Indoor, as well as outdoor air temperatures can affect its effects, she said.

Most air conditioners, for example, take in hot summer air. Because they cool it, they also raise its relative humidity.

"As a result, people may develop a 'wet' cough, even when the relative humidity outdoors isn't too bad. Other typical effects of high humidity can be irritability, red eyes and a general feeling of tiredness," Ms. Knapp said.

The reverse often happens in winter, she said. Most furnaces take in cold outdoor air, heat it and thus lower its humidity level. The results then can range from static electricity to dry skin.
