Did you know...it takes about 5 minutes to milk a cow in the double 30 parallel milking parlor, it takes three 8-hour shifts of 3 people to keep the parlor in operation 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and the cows will be milked 3 times a day producing 135,000 wheel (of which I am not fond pounds of milk every day, which of!).
