"The Prairie Land Food project has become a ministry for the communities of St. Francis and Bird City helping to stretch dollars with a monthly grocery package and volunteer projects that range from assisting other residents, church and community projects and 4-H leadership, Boy Scouts leaders, visiting homebound friends, writing letters to the armed service overseas, and many other events," said Lee Nichols, local contact person for the organization. "This month peeked volunteer hours a month with 769 hours. To date, nearly 103 residents in Saint Francis, Bird City and Haigler have been participants with the number each month varving from 35 to 55.

Prairie Land Food is a not-forprofit organization that offers a Ms. Nichols, 785-332-3581.
