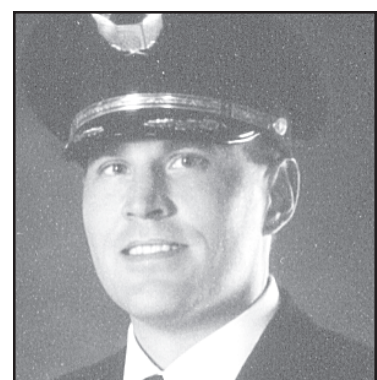

Two men recently become captains

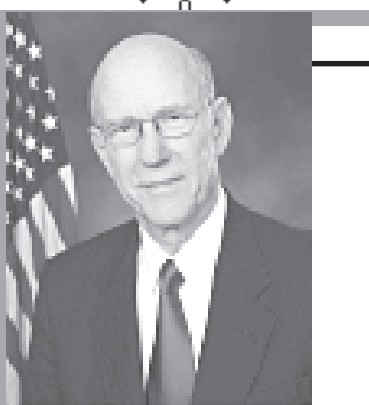
