On Aug. 3, they ran into a torrential rain storm, putting them behind a little but they were able to make it to Sturgis by Aug. 4. The next two days were spent touring the Black Hills.

They left South Dakota on Aug. 7 and made it to Billings, Mont. They traveled on to Yellowstone National Park and then to the Grand Teton Mountains. On Aug. 10, they left Rock Springs, Wyo., and pulled into Bird City around 8 p.m. that night.

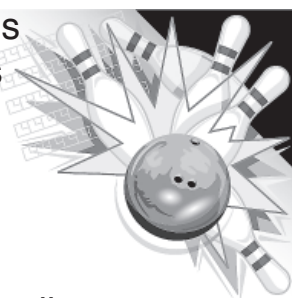
