Giving a new definition to C&W - Comedy and Western - this exceptional group carries on the superlative standards and integrity of Sons

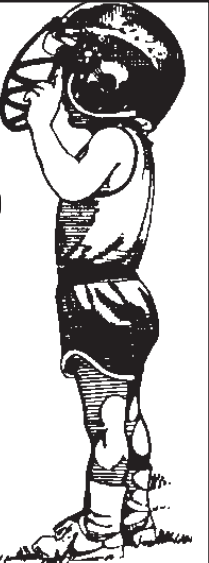
