Their high game was 90 points against Greeley County 0. Everyone on Team B scored in the competition.

The next Scholars' Bowl will be the sixth, seventh, and eighth grade classes and will be at 4:00 p.m. on Monday, Oct. 29 at Golden Plains School, Rexford.
