Students from nine schools compete well

Monday night was the Scholars' Bowl for the seventh and eighth graders at Cheylin School. And the questions that were asked would have had anyone scratching their heads. Anyone over 13 years old.
The Scholars' Bowl is a meet in which seventh and eighth graders from different schools come together and have a "battle of the minds." This year's nine competing schools were: Cheylin, Brewster, Greeley County, Wallace County, Goodland, Triplains, Oberlin, Golden Plains and Atwood. Coordination of the meet was by Marjean Zumbahlen and Rose Hengen. The program is designed to provide an opportunity for the students to show what they know by answering a series of

questions.
A timed competition, much like a track meet, has teams representing each school rotate through five different school rooms answering questions. There are nine rounds in which teams from each grade answer 16 questions from different subjects of math, English, science, social science, sports and current events. The first team with the correct answer receives the points. Each round has a possibility of 160 points.
The eighth grade class was represented by Wil Orten, Ethan Young and Dalton Magnani, who was absent due to illness. Wil Orten had an individual high point for the series of 320 points. Ethan Young scored a total of 170 points with two rounds of competition at 50 point each to his credit. Their high game was 80 points against Triplains 10.
The seventh grade class was represented by two teams. Team A was Miguel Navarro, Stephanie Busse, the high scorer with 270 points, Adam Orten scored 210, Cassie Rucker, and Josh Keltz. Their high game was 90 points against Golden Plains 20. Team B was Jessica Smith, Kenan Reeh, the high scorer with 190 point, Caleb Frink, Tyler Michaelis, and Megan Els. Their high game was 90 points against Greeley County 0. Everyone on Team B scored in the competition.
The next Scholars' Bowl will be the sixth, seventh, and eighth grade classes and will be at 4:00 p.m. on Monday, Oct. 29 at Golden Plains School, Rexford.

The St. Francis Clinic is now open from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays; 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Fridays; and 9 a.m. to noon on Saturdays.
Regarding the Saturday morning clinics:
• The clinic will be on a walk-in basis only — there will be no scheduled appointments.
• There will be only one provider in the clinic that day.
• Patients will be seen on a first-come-first-serve basis.
• The clinic will be canceled if the provider is called to the emergency room.
The Bird City Clinic is now open 9 a.m. to noon Mondays through Fridays. It is important to note that the Bird City Clinic will no longer be open on Thursday afternoons. Each provider will be in the clinic one day per week and another provider will fill in on those days when the scheduled provider cannot be in the clinic.
The normal schedule will be Tyler Raile on Mondays; Dr. Allard on Tuesdays; Patrick Delano on Wednesdays; Dr. Miller on Thursdays; and Kristle Neuhalfen on Fridays.
The county health nurse is now in the Bird City Clinic from 1 to 4 p.m. on Mondays.

An open house is being planned from 2 to 4 p.m. on Nov. 11 at the Cheyenne County Hospital. Everyone is urged to come meet the providers as well as the new ambulance bay, patient beds and lifts and the physical therapy area.
