

ORDINANCE NO. 314 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING OR-DINANCE 313, WHICHADOPTED BY REFERENCE THE "STAN-DARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR KANSAS CITIES, EDITION 2007" BY DELETING SECTIONS 114.1 AND 114.2 AND AUTHORIZ-ING, UNDER CERTAIN CONDI-TIONS, THE OPERATION OF WORK SITE UTILITY VEHICLES AND ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES ON CERTAIN STREETS WITHIN THECORPORATELIMITSOFTHE CITY OF BIRD CITY. KANSAS: PROVIDING; FOR RELATED MAT-TERS INCLUDING; PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREON.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOV-ERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF BIRD CITY, KANSAS, that sections 114.1 and 114.2 of the Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities as adopted by reference pursuant to Ordinance 313 be deleted and the following be adopted:

Section 1. OPERATION OF WORK SITE UTILITY VEHICLES AND ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES; PEN-ALTY

(a) Work-site utility vehicles and all-terrain vehicles may be operated upon the public highways, streets, roads, and alleys within the corporate limits of the city between sunrise and 10 p.m.

(b) No work-site utility vehicle shall be operated on any public highway, street, road, or alley unless such vehicle shall comply with the equipment requirements under the provisions of article 17, chapter 8 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated.

of their age may operate a work-site utility vehicle or all-terrain vehicle so long as such operation is with their parent or legal guardian. The parent or legal guardian must either be a passenger on the same work-site utility vehicle or all-terrain vehicle or within 15 feet of said vehicle driven by the non-licensed operator.

(g) A violation of this section shall be deemed an ordinance traffic infraction. Upon any entry of a plea of guilty or no contest or upon being convicted of such violation, the penalty imposed shall be in accordance with Section 201, 2007 Standard Traffic Ordinance, and amendments thereto, or such other similar provision as the city may then have in effect.

(h) Work-site utility vehicles and all-terrain vehicles shall not exceed 20 mph.

(i) All work-site utility vehicles and all-terrain vehicles shall be equipped, maintained and operated so as to prevent excessive or unusual noise.

(j) All laws, ordinances and other rules of the road that are applicable to the operator or occupant of a motor vehicle within the city limits are also applicable to operators and riders of work-site utility vehicles and all-terrain vehicles.

Section 2.DEFINITIONS

(a) "Work-site utility vehicle" means any motor vehicle which is not less than 48 inches in width, has an overall length, including the bumper of not more than 135 inches, has an unladen weight, including fuel ad fluids, of more than 800 pounds and is equipped with four or more low pressure tires, a steering wheel,






(c) No all-terrain vehicle shall be operated on any public highway, street, road, or alley after sunset, unless equipped with lights as required for motorcycles.

(d) No person shall operate a work-site vehicle and all-terrain vehicles on any public highway, street, road or alley within the corporate limits of the city unless such person has a valid driver's license.

(e) No person under the age of 18 years shall operate or ride upon a work-site utility vehicle or an all-terrain vehicle unless wearing a helmet which complies with minimum guidelines established by the national highway traffic safety administration pursuant to the national traffic and motor vehicle safety act of 1966 for helmets designed for use by motorcyclists and other motor vehicle users, along with applicable eye protection.

(f) No person, except those expressly exempted, shall driver or operate any work-site utility vehicle or all-terrain vehicle upon any street in this city unless such person has a valid driver's license. Any person under the age of sixteen (16) that does not have a driver's license, solely due to the fact that they are not eligible for the same as a result and bench or bucket type seating allowing at least two people to sit side-by-side, and may be equipped with a bed or cargo box for hauling materials.

(b) "All-terrain vehicle" means any motorized non-highway vehicle 48 inches or less in width, having a dry weight of 1,000 pounds or less, traveling on three or more low pressure tires, and having a seat to be strutted by the operator. As used in this subsection, "low pressure tire" means any pneumatic tire six inches or more in width, designed for use on wheels with rim diameter of 12 inches or less, and utilizing an operating pressure of 10 pounds per square inch or less as recommended by the vehicle manufacturer.

This ordinance shall take effect and be enforced from and after its publication in the official city newspaper, the Bird City Times.
