An American Football League game was being played between the New York Jets and the Oakland Raiders. They were two of the marquee teams of the era and the game featured 10 future Hall of Fame inductees.

Behind quarterback Joe Namath, the Jets were leading in the fourth period 32-29. After a Jim Turner field goal, the Raiders got the ball with 65 seconds to go.

Suddenly, millions of television sets changed from the football game to a made-for-TV version of 'Heidi.'

Now the story of Heidi is a good one. It is a fictional tale about an orphan girl in the Alps. Written in 1880 by Johanna Spyri, it is not only a great example of children's writing, but it is a well known piece of Swiss literature.

NBC, the station that was airing the game, and then Heidi, simply followed its programming schedule and at 7 p.m., eastern standard time, the children's show began.
