Students visited a dry playa lake basin outside of Wheeler; a small artesian spring 3 miles north of St. Francis; a creek and the River Walk, in order to learn about the High Plains Ogallala Aquifer.

Julie Boatright, conservation educator, Lubbock, Texas, and Andy Wilkenson, artist-in-residence, Lubbock, Texas, presented a session on bird identification and one on creative writing, which included song and poetry.
