Farmers and ranchers are re- and Farm-raised Fish (ELAP) requirements will be waived noninsured disaster coverage by the applicable sales closing date, provided that the producer files an application for a waiver and pays a "buy-in" fee in an noninsured disaster assistance coverage or catastrophic risk protection plan fee for the crop or grazing lands.

In July 2008, the Department of Agriculture announced the "buy-in" waiver deadline and application process. Producers who do not pay the fee by the Sept. 16, deadline will not be eligible for disaster assistance under the Supplemental Agricultural Disaster Assistance

Mr. Lasseter also reminded producers that the payment of the applicable fee does not provide them with crop insurance or Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program indemnity payment for losses; it only makes them eligible to apply for assistance under the Supplemental Agricultural Disaster Assistance programs.
