

Local group gathers to discuss activities

Booster club meeting convened in the Cheylin High School library in Bird City on Wednesday, Sept. 3.

Jan Busse reported collections of \$255 from concessions, \$442 from the tailgate party and \$320 from 16 memberships. She indicated there was a grocery bill outstanding with Hometown Market.

Kasten's Photography took the volleyball photos with pre-orders and is making posters available that can be used as a possible fundraiser. Jolene Reeh questioned whether the volleyball team was authorized to have a fundraiser. The team will have to approach the board of education about this possibility. Tina Sager thought if they were not able to have a fundraiser, the booster club could use the posters to somehow promote the volleyball team and/or have a fundraiser.

Portraits by Darci has taken football photos with pre-orders. She will keep the negatives through the end of the school year for anyone who missed the pre-order. She is also offering buttons at only \$3 and for every button sold will donate \$1 to booster club.

Wendy White inquired about the purchase of the LG screen, this was tabled until the October meeting. The sports sign for gym for Wheatland/Grinnell/Dighton was tabled until the October meeting.

Mrs. Busse reported she had found larger duffel bags for \$22.61 with a minimum order of 12. Members agreed to order 12 bags in navy blue, black straps and white accents (no individual names will be embroidered on bags, but will have Cheylin Cougars embroidered). Mrs. Busse agreed to get this order placed.

Rodney Klepper indicated that 42-inch fans could be purchased at Orschelns for \$279/fan or at Sam's Club for about \$105/fan. He agreed to call the Salina Sam's Club store to check if available and Mrs. Reeh agreed to pick them up over the weekend. If unavailable at Sam's, then will readdress this at the October meeting and watch for additional markdowns at Orschelns.

Laurie Leonard reported that the Cheylin Cougar flag for the Bird City entrance was ordered from Colby Commercial Sign Company and should be finished this week. The cost is \$150, which includes the art set-up fee. Future replacement flags re-ordered should only cost \$100. Mrs. Leonard agreed to request a copy of the purchased artwork from the company for future use by the club.

Fireworks (class B, no licensing needed) for the home football games was discussed. Mrs. White will purchase the fireworks from Charlene Kramer and ask Dan Bowers if he would be willing to set the fireworks off for the club at the games.

Jane Young stepped into the meeting to report on getting shirts for the Cheylin coaches. After some discussion on the shirt design choices and the number of shirts needed, Mrs. Young agreed to order a few sample shirts. Mrs. Reeh agreed to get design input and sizes from the coaches at the coaches meeting on Sept. 19. A decision on shirts/hats for fundraising was tabled until the October meeting.

Mrs. White indicated there are four Fifth Quarter parties to plan and approximately 50 kids would attend. Mrs. Leonard reported that the Immanuel United Methodist Church in Bird City approved the continued use of the Fellowship Hall for these parties. The first two parties are Sept. 12 and 19. Mrs. Busse, Mrs. Sager and Mrs. Leonard agreed to plan for Sept. 12, serving barbecue ribs, and Mrs. White and Mrs. Reeh agreed to plan for Sept. 19.

Repainting the Cougar sign at the football field entrance was discussed. Mrs. White agreed to contact the Hot Brush for an estimate of a touch up.

Members discussed the homecoming meal fundraiser and it was agreed to serve hamburgers, hot dogs, brauts, potato salad, baked beans, wrapped cookies/brownies, tea and coffee. Mrs. Sager agreed to get signup sheets for food donations and workers schedules printed and placed at each of the grocery stores. Mr. Klepper inquired about whether the club had a web page set-up or coordinated with www.Cheylin.com. Mrs. Reeh stated that she is looking into getting a web page set up for the athletics department and agreed to follow-up on this for the booster club.

Mrs. White reported that there would not be a parade for homecoming. She was not aware of any sort of theme for the week and did not know if we would be asked to do a skit.

Mr. Klepper passed out copies of the parent letter that will be provided to the superintendent to send to parents of children who have a need for items of school clothing. The children will receive a combination of new and gently used clothing. Members recommended that the letter be printed in English and Spanish. Cindy Burr, owner of Second Beginning, has agreed to donate clothes from the local thrift store. A start-up donation was turned over to Mrs. Busse to set up a separate fund and Mrs. White agreed to serve as the coordinator for this program.

Mrs. White stated she had found practice jerseys on sale for \$9.99 from Eastbay. The members agreed to purchase for both junior high and high school and Mrs. Busse agreed to place this order. The intent of the club is that the jerseys are to be checked out and returned each season with the game uniforms.

The auction of two footballs and two volleyballs was discussed. Mrs. Sager agreed to line up the auctioneer. Mrs. Busse agreed to coordinate getting the balls signed for the auction and replacement balls with the coaches.

Booster Club membership from the community were discussed. Mrs. Sager and Mrs. Leonard agreed to make a flyer that could be sent home with students, posted around communities and passed out at upcoming school events.
