A great deal of the Chevenne County Hospital Board meeting was spent talking about the facility's improvement plan deficiency list. In the end, the board members were asked to select five of the the least important.

Not being at the hospital everyday makes it hard to know what is needed or not needed, said Traci Neitzel. She suggested that the board do a "walk through" the hospital on a busy day.

There were 29 suggestions on the list. Suggestions ranged from needing more office and storage space and a remodeled kitchen to needing a bigger elevator, a separate area for the CAT scan and

The administrator and staff had been diligently working on ideas to give more room to the kitchen area. **Public Notice** NW KS GMD#4 WTAP Sign-up Starts October 1

The State Conservation Commission will begin accepting applications for the Water Right Retirement Program, WTAP, beginning October 1.

WTAP is a voluntary, incentivebased program designed to help restore aquifers and streams in critical areas. Six "High Priority" units in the Northwest Kansas Groundwater Management District No. 4 have been designated as eligible target areas by the Chief Engineer because of significant water level declines. They have been designated to be in need of aquifer recovery and are now closed to further appropriations of water. These six areas in Cheyenne, Sherman, Thomas and Sheridan counties are also the subject of additional management program protocols being discussed with landowners by GMD#4.

Applicants who are selected for WTAP grants are compensated by the State Con-

servation Commission in exchange for the permanent retirement of a water right. Priority is given to retiring water rights in areas which would have the greatest impact on the aguifer system. WTAP grants are approved on the basis of competitive bids and the amount of Historic Consumptive Water Use which has been established under the water right.

A fixed rate price of \$2,000 per acrefoot of Historic Consumptive Water Use is available for eligible water rights

To be eligible, water rights must have been actively used in the last 10 years. Dryland farming is permitted after a water right is retired. Limited irrigation can be temporarily allowed to establish a permanent cover on the land being transitioned from irrigation. Partial water right reductions can also be considered for retirement grants.

The Fall sign-up period is October 2008 through November 15, 2008. If program funds are still available, a Spring sign-up period will be held on February 15 through March 31, 2009.
