Band shell repairs At just a glance, the band shell appears to be in good condition but, after a tour through the back interior, there are some obvious roblems including water damge. The roof is in bad condiand the drainage is poor. The plaster on the outside is actually contributing to the water damge, allowing water to seep beween it and the original exterior brick walls. This has caused the
lath, plaster walls and ceiling to crumble.
