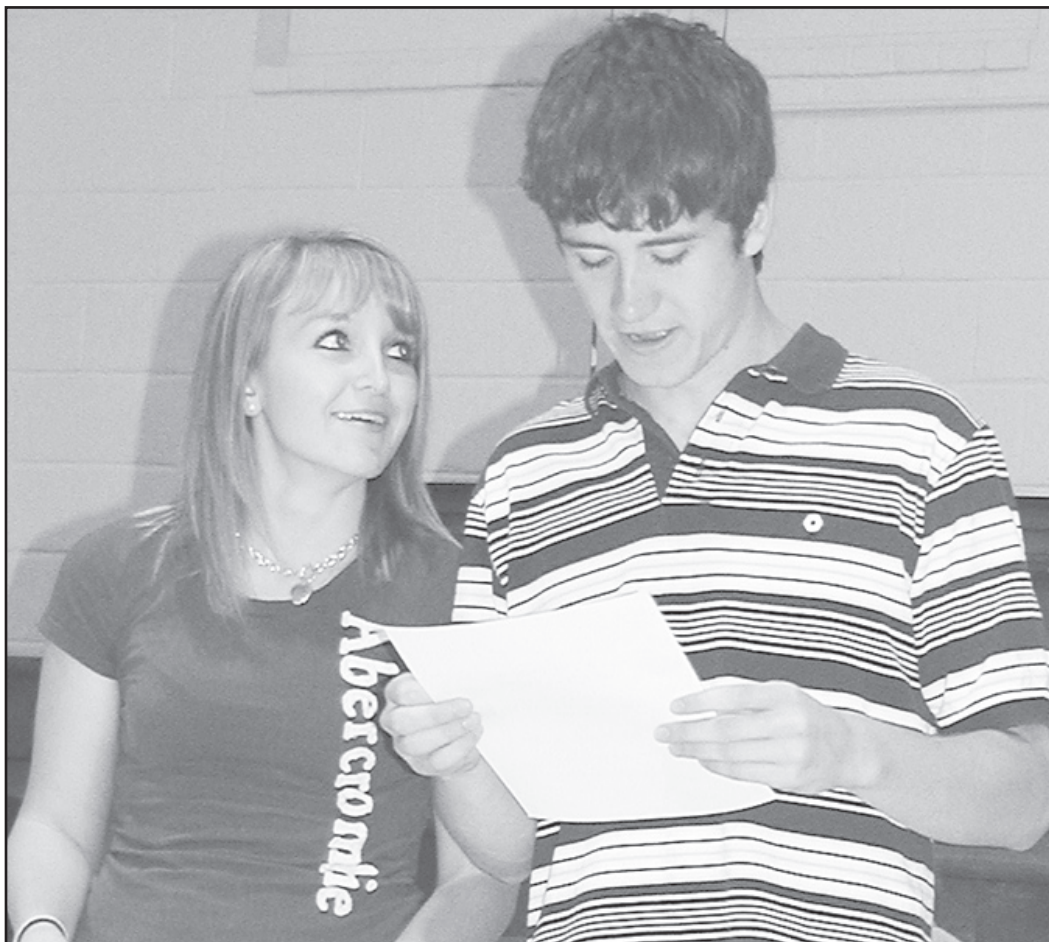
Students honored
