

Sept. 1 is the final date to pay the applicable service fee and obtain Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program coverage for triticale, barley, rye and wheat for hay. For 2010, Continuous Crop Wheat planted with the intention of harvesting as grain is not eligible for this program.

There is an administrative service fee per crop per administra- obtain Noninsured Crop Disaster tive county. Interested producers Assistance Program coverage on must pay the fee and file form the above crops.

This coverage entitles eligible cent of an average market price

In the unfortunate event that a producer does suffer a loss on their particular crop, a form CCC-576, Notice of Loss, must be filed with Farm Service Agency within 15 calendar days after the disaster occurrence, or the date the loss becomes apparent to the producer.
