After discussion, commissioners agreed to hire Padgett, dispatcher, as the 911 department head. She and Mrs. Gamblin will switch positions and salary. The change will take effect Nov. 1.

County attorney

Kari Gilliland, county attorney, said there would be a mock emergency preparedness drill concerning Bonny Dam the first part of November. A previous mock drill was held at the hospital and there were some communication problems, she said. Dolores Jenik, county treasurer,
