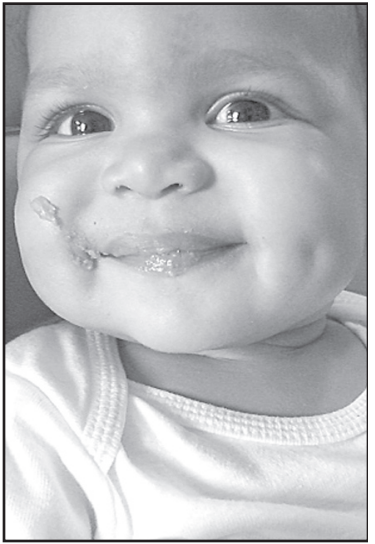

The three finalists' pictures will appear on ABCNews.com/GMA, the website of GMA digital, so the general public can view each finalist photo and vote online for

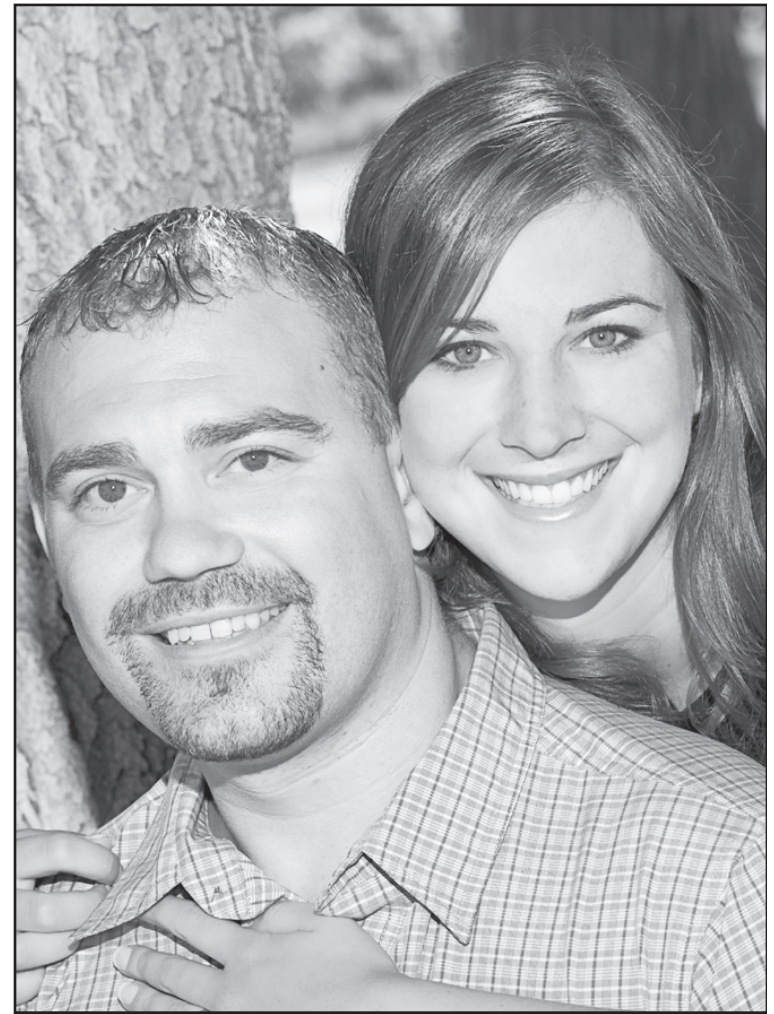

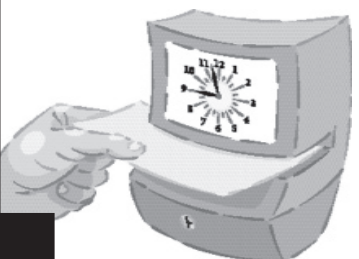
