Sponsored by the Bethany College Art Department, the show features 81 works by students currently enrolled in art classes.

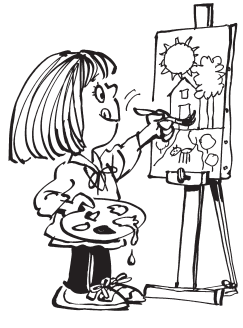
