Cheylin hosted the first Junior Rexford. High Scholar's Bowl of the season on Monday in Bird City. Schools who competed in the tournament were Brewster, Greeley County, Goodland, Golden Plains, Triplains, Weskan, Wallace County, Oberlin, Rawlins County and the host school, Cheylin.

All of the teams competed in a round-robin format in which each school played every other school one time. This is the first tournament of the season for both the seventh and eighth grades from Cheylin.

In the eighth grade division, Rawlins County was the winner with a record of seven wins and two losses. Oberlin was the runnerup, finishing in a three-way tie with Cheylin and Greeley County with a six-three record. Oberlin won the tie breaker based on a margin of victory with the teams who were tied.
