Cheylin Cougars defeat Natoma

The Cheylin High School Cougars defeated Natoma in varsity football action on Friday night in Natoma. The final score was Cheylin 22, Natoma 18.

This is by far the smallest margin of victory for the Cougars this year. Natoma was a non-conference, non-district game and the seventh win of the season for the Cougars.

Going into the final two regular season games of the year, the Cougars are leading Eight Man Division II, District 7 with a 4-0 district record. Other teams in the district and their standings include: Sharon Spring/Wallace County 3-1, Tribune/Greeley County 3-1, Weskan 2-2, Rexford/Golden Plains 2-3, Grainfield/Wheatland/Grinnell 1-3 and Triplains/Brewster 0-5.

Cheylin has two district games remaining. They play Tribune/Greeley County at Cheylin on Friday and meet Triplains/Brewster in Brewster on Thursday, Oct. 28.

The two leading teams in District 7 will compete in Eight-Man Division II Bi-district play on Tuesday, Nov. 2.

The Natoma game saw the Cougars score one touchdown in each of the first, second and fourth quarters and also have two successful conversion attempts. Natoma had one touchdown in the first quarter and two in the second. The difference came down to the Cougars not allowing Natoma any conversion points.

"We traveled quite a distance (north of Russell) to play a stubborn opponent," Coach Max Keltz said. "We will have a lot to work on to prepare for our upcoming game against Tribune."

Scoring the touchdowns for the Cougars were Dalton Magnani with two scores, both on rushing plays. Jeremiah White scored the other touchdown. Having successful conversion attempts were Chris Walden and Jared Cahoj.

Offensively, the Cougars had 295 yards rushing against Natoma with Magnani having 120 yards,

Cahoj, 92 yards and Caleb Keltz, 83 yards. Keltz was 6-of-13 in passing attempts for 97 yards. Ethan Young received three passes for 58 yards while Walden had one for 27 yards and Cahoj, two for 12 yards.

Defensively Noah Jones and Kenan Reeh each had 15 tackles and Cahoj 10 to lead the team. Ten players had at least one tackle.

Other stats show that Walden had one sack and Keltz and White each had an interception. Reeh recovered one fumble.

White handled four kickoff returns for the Cougars for a total of 80 yards while Magnani and Adrian Garcia did the kicking for the Cougars with Magnani having three for 143 yards and Garcia, one for 45 yards. Ethan Young was the punter and he had two for a total of 82 yards.

Cheylin hosted the first Junior High Scholar's Bowl of the season on Monday in Bird City. Schools who competed in the tournament were Brewster, Greeley County, Goodland, Golden Plains, Triplains, Weskan, Wallace County, Oberlin, Rawlins County and the host school, Cheylin.

All of the teams competed in a round-robin format in which each school played every other school one time. This is the first tournament of the season for both the seventh and eighth grades from Cheylin.

In the eighth grade division, Rawlins County was the winner with a record of seven wins and two losses. Oberlin was the runner-up, finishing in a three-way tie with Cheylin and Greeley County with a six-three record. Oberlin won the tie breaker based on a margin of victory with the teams who were tied. Cheylin ended up in third place.

In the seventh grade division, Oberlin took top honors with a perfect nine-zero record. Rawlins County was the runner-up with a seven-two record, and Golden Plains and Cheylin tied for third place with a record of six-three.

"I believe this was a good learning experience and a great way to get the season started," said Coach Kale Shields. "I would like to thank everyone who donated their time to help run the tournament...without the many volunteers, the Scholar's Bowl could not have happened."
