The Cheylin Cougars just keep rolling along. Win number eight came Friday night when the Cougars entertained Greeley County/Tribune in Bird City. This was both a Western Kansas Liberty League game and an Eight-Man Division II District 7 game. The final score was Cheylin 58, Greeley County 12.

Going into the final regular season game of the year, the Cougars are leading Eight Man Division II, District 7 with a 5-0 district record. Other teams in the district and their standings include: Sharon Spring/ Wallace County 4-1, Tribune/ Greeley County 3-2, Rexford/ Golden Plains 3-3, Weskan 2-3, Grainfield/Wheatland/Grinnell 1-4 and Triplains/Brewster 0-5.

The two leading teams in District 7 will compete in Eight-Man Division II Bi-district play on Tuesday, Nov. 2. The Cougars will have the home field advantage for the first two rounds of the playoff. The play time on Tuesday will be 6 p.m.

"This was an exciting game...to get a win from a good team," Coach Max Keltz said. "A lot of our kids stepped up and played big against a very tough opponent who has given us problem in the past.


We are looking forward to completing the regular season against a fast Triplains/Brewster team this Thursday."

Against Greeley County the Cougars had a 42-0 advantage going into the second half, where they added two additional scores. Greeley County scored in the second and fourth quarters.

The 58 points for Cheylin came from Caleb Keltz having three touchdowns and three conversions for 24 points, Jared Cahoj having threetouchdownsandoneconversion for 20 points; Dalton Magnani with one touchdown, Noah Jones with one touchdown and Mitchel Jensen with one successful conversion.

The scoring in the first quarter came from a 5-yard run, an 8-yard run and a 12-yard run. There were also three touchdowns in the second quarter from a 13-yard run, a 12yard run and a 24-yard run.

The second half saw the Cougars score on a 6-yard run and a 2-yard

The Cougars recorded 11 first downs in the game.

The team had 327 yards on the ground and 10 yards in the air (a pass from Keltz to Ethan Young). Leading the rushing was Cahoj with 125 yards.

Defensively the team collected a total of 24 tackles and 57 assisted tackles. Leading the way were Cahoj with a total of 14, Keltz and Noah Jones with 13 each and Adrian Garcia with 10.

Having sacks were Cahoj and Garcia with two each and Keltz and Jones with one each. The lone interceptions was by Jeremiah White and Jones, Kenan Reeh and Young each recovered a fumble. White had a 24-yard punt return and Chris Walden a 10-yard kickoff return. Punting for the Cougars was Young with a 50-yard punt while Magnani had eight kickoffs for a total of 352


