

Cougars moves into post season

The Cheyenne Cougar football team finished the regular season with a perfect 9-0 record and moved into post-season play on Tuesday night against the Victoria Knights. The Knights traveled to Bird City as Cheylin won District 7 while the Knights with their 7-2 record placed second in District 8. Details of the Cheylin-Victoria game will be published next week as it will be past the deadline for the Times. The score of the Tuesday game will be in a box on the front page. Post-season play is single elimination, so only the winner advances.

The winner of this competition will be playing the winner of the Otis-Bison/Fowler game in regional action. Otis-Bison has a 9-0 record and Fowler a 7-2 record. Further competition will be at sub-state and state.

"A good win to go to 9-0," Coach Max Keltz said. "We are excited to play a good Victoria team for the first round of playoffs on Tuesday."

Cheylin came out ready to play Friday night and had 50 points on the scoreboard before half time. Play was suspended at this point. Forty-two of the points were scored in the first quarter and eight in the second period.

The team had a total of 139 yards rushing with only two

attempted passes, which were both incomplete.

The team had a total of six touchdowns for 36 points, five conversion runs for 10 points and one safety for two points.

Jared Cahoj scored 20 points for the evening on two touchdowns and four conversion runs.

The other athletes with over 10 points was Dalton Magnani who had two touchdowns for 12 points.

Also scoring were Kenan Reeh and Eddie Frisbie with one touchdown each and Ethan Young with a conversion run and a safety.

Defense is a very important part of any sporting activity and in this game 16 different players accounted for 15 tackles and 46 assists. Cahoj led the team with five tackles and five assists for a total of 10. Having a total of six were Noah Jones with one tackle and five assists, Jeremiah White with one tackle and five assists, and Austin Manners with two tackles and four assists.

Other stats show Luis Solis had a sack, Magnani, Reeh and Adrian Garcia had a fumble recovery, Young had a 43-yard punt return and White had a 17-yard kickoff return.

Magnani handled the kickoffs, having a total of 264 yards on six attempts.

The general election is over and Republican, Ward Cassidy, St. Francis, who was running for representative of the 120 District, won by a landslide over Robert "Bob" Strevey, Democrat from Ludell. The county total was Cassidy, 860, and Strevey, 232.

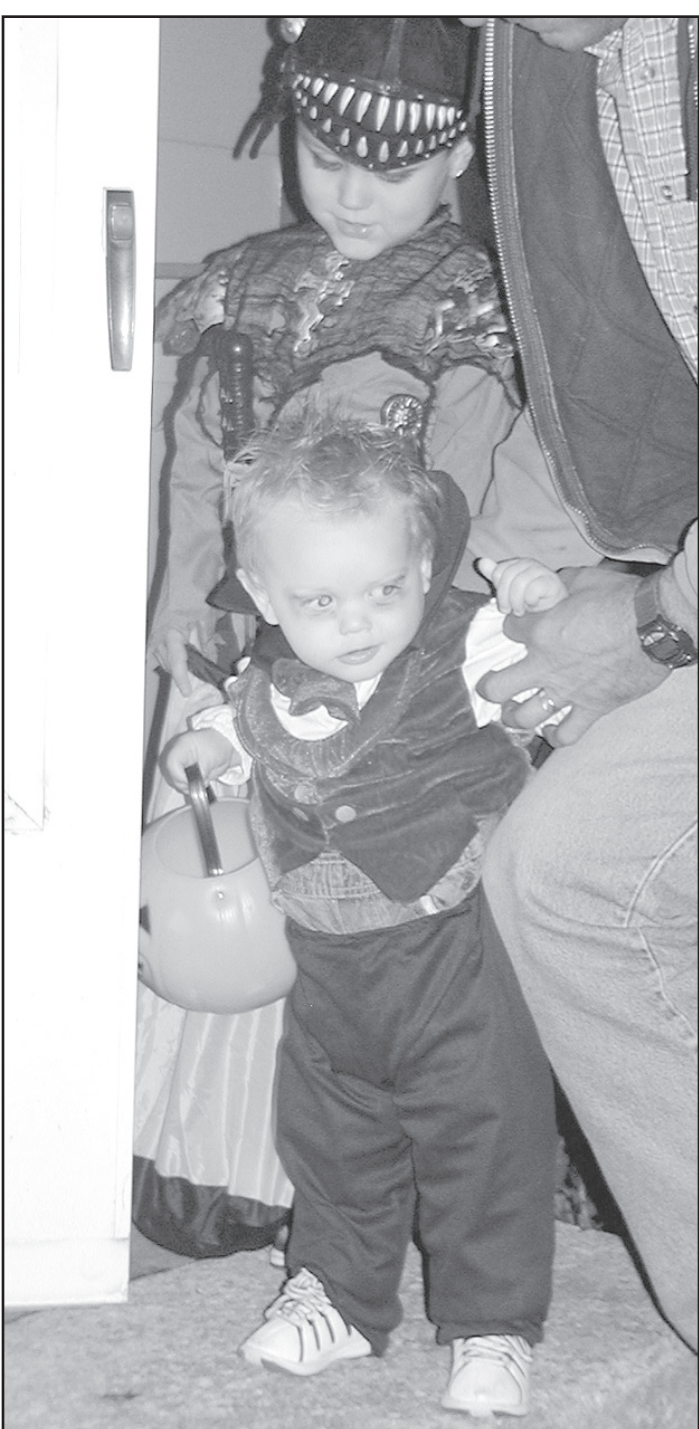
The final tally in the five 120th District counties (Cheyenne, Rawlins, Decatur, Norton and Phillips) was unavailable at the time the paper went to press but it appeared that Cassidy had won.

Terry Miller, county election officer, said, as of Monday at noon when the advanced voting booth closed, there had been 220 people voting and 103 ballots had been sent out and 320 votes were counted.

In all, 832 of the 1,904 registered voters or 44 percent, cast their ballots. This included

the advanced voters.
Ernie Ketzner, Democrat, was running unopposed for commissioner of District No. 1, the Bird City district. He accumulated 214 votes.

Daylight saving time ends on Sunday

After a beautiful fall with the exception of some wind and little rain, Daylight Saving Time will come to an end shortly.

The clocks will turn back an hour on Sunday, which means the evenings will seem longer throughout the winter, as the sun sets earlier.

Under federal law, daylight time ends at 2 a.m. Sunday, Nov. 7.
