Not required by statute, but the Northwest Kansas Groundwater Management District No. 4 board of directors is scheduling a public hearing to hear comments from the landowners and water users of high priority area SD-6 regarding the possible implementation of an enhanced management plan for the HPA that is intended to slow the decline rate and extend the economic life of the local aquifer while having as little economic impact to the region as practical.

The hearing will begin at 1:00 P.M. CST in the Hoxie Elks Lodge, Rt 2 (West of town) Hoxie, KS on March 3, 2011. The board is interested in hearing comments from any stakeholder in the HPA (High Priority Area) prior to approving the final management plan for incorporation into the NW Kansas GMD 4 Revised Management Program later this year. The draft under consideration is the culmination of eight meetings between November 10, 2008 and January 19, 2011.
