

# Cheylin Cougars win Friday game

The Cheylin boys won a Western Kansas/Liberty League basketball game over Wheatland/Grinnell in Grainfield on Friday night by the score of 49-44. Earlier in the week they were defeated by Rawlins County 67-60 in a non-league battle held on the home court.

The Cougars have two home games this week, Golden Plains, which they played on Tuesday night and Weskan coming on Friday night.

## Vs Rawlins County

Caleb Keltz led the Cougars with 16 points against Rawlins County on Jan. 25, Kenan Reeh had 14 with Adrian Garcia next with 10 points.

Cheylin outscored the Buffs in the final quarter but Rawlins County had enough of a lead to finish the game with the 67-60 victory. The Cougars had a high scoring 30 points in the fourth quarter. The Buffs were ahead 46-30 going into the final frame.

The Cougars were 42 percent from the field (25/60) and 50 percent from the line (2/4), where they had very few opportunities.

Leading the rebounding was Garcia with 11 while Joshua Keltz had two blocks and C. Keltz one for the team total of three. The Cougars had nine steals with Heath Antholz having four and he also led in assists with 4 of the 11 recorded.

The Cougars were up 27-23 at halftime with Cheylin hitting for 22 after the break and Wheatland/Grinnell 21.

Magnani hit for 11 points in this league game with C. Keltz and Young each having eight.

Cheylin was 46 percent from the field, hitting 22-of-48. At the line they hit 4-of-9. Garcia had the best field goals percentage with 80, as he hit 4-of-5 attempts. At the line Magnani was 2-of-2.

The team had 30 rebounds with only seven of them being offensive boards. Three players, Garcia, C. Keltz and Young each had six. C. Keltz and J. Keltz each had two blocks while Young had one. Antholz had four assists.

Kiser from Wheatland/Grinnell was the leading scorer for the game with 25 points.

"I was proud of the way some of the girls stepped their defensive game up to the next level," Coach Jones said. "We need to find a way to make better decisions on the court."

cent shooting for the night."

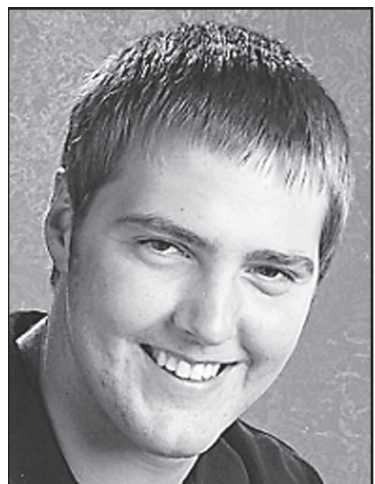
## A-team

Not required by statute, but the Northwest Kansas Groundwater Management District No. 4 board of directors is scheduling a public hearing to hear comments from the landowners and water users of high priority area SD-6 regarding the possible implementation of an enhanced management plan for the HPA that is intended to slow the decline rate and extend the economic life of the local aquifer while having as little economic impact to the region as practical.

The hearing will begin at 1:00 P.M. CST in the Hoxie Elks Lodge, Rt 2 (West of town) Hoxie, KS on March 3, 2011. The board is interested in hearing comments from any stakeholder in the HPA (High Priority Area) prior to approving the final management plan for incorporation into the NW Kansas GMD 4 Revised Management Program later this year. The draft under consideration is the culmination of eight meetings between November 10, 2008 and January 19, 2011.
