On Feb. 17, the Cheylin Junior High Lady Cougars traveled to Dighton to play in the league basketball tournament.

Cheylin A team drew Brewster for first round. At halftime, the score was close with Cheylin leading 18-15. At the beginning of the fourth quarter, Brewster took the lead, but Cheylin came back strong and won 34-25.

Mary Anne Orten was the top scorer with 17 points for the Cougars, along with four rebounds and two steals. Allie Frisbie scored 11 points and had seven rebounds and four steals. Diana Garcia scored 4 points with four steals. Jaime Davison scored on one of her offensive rebounds with 2 points. She had 10 rebounds, two steals, and four blocked shots. Elizabeth Keltz grabbed seven rebounds and had two blocks, and Elsa Craig Burr had two rebounds. The Cougars shot a much better 33 percent from the field and 50 percent from the free throw line.

"We played a real steady game and adjusted to do what we needed to do to win," Coach Dan Carson said. "The ladies kept their poise the whole game."

Since Cheylin won the first game, they played the number one seeded Grinnell-Wheatland Thun-

derhawks in the second contest of the day. It was a close game with a 2 point difference until about 1 minute to go to half time, when the Thunderhawks took a 13-6 lead. Cheylin kept it close in the third quarter, but in the fourth quarter, Grinnell-Wheatland hit their shots and won 35-12.

Allie led the Cougars with 6 points, five rebounds, four steals, and three blocked shots. Mary Anne, Jaime and Diana all had 2 points each. Jaime had five rebounds and two blocks, while Mary Anne had two blocks. Elizabeth had four rebounds and five steals and three blocks, while Elsa Craig got two steals. Danae Mag-nani had one rebound and one steal in the game.

"It was a tough loss for the Lady Cougars, but we played hard the entire game," Coach Carson said. "The loss ended the season for the Cougars. The A-team finished the season with a 6-9 record and the B-team finished with a 6-4 record."

"Both teams were a lot of fun to watch this year and everyone made tremendous improvement in their play. It has been a real pleasure coaching the Lady Cougars this season and we expect to see some great things of the girls in the years to come."

3D movies will be available soon at St. Francis theater

The Cheyenne Theater in St. Francis will soon be able to show 3D movies.

Robert Grace, member of the Theater Committee, reported that the new screen has arrived and on Monday, the crew will arrive to install the digital equipment, new screen, new sound boards and subwoofer speaker.

Several months ago, the Theater Committee began raising money to purchase the equipment which was estimated to cost around \$95,000. The city of St. Francis had budgeted to help with the purchase but would take several years before there would be enough money. Mr. Grace thought it was important to purchase the equipment sooner as, in the future, there might be a high demand.

At the Jan. 10, city council meeting, Mr. Grace said \$41,000 had been donated and, with the city's budgeted amount of \$12,500, they could pay the 50 percent necessary to purchase the digital equipment. The city then made a lease agreement with Bankwest St. Francis for the remaining money needed.

The "digital premiere" of the Cheyenne Theater is set for Friday, Saturday and Sunday, March 4, through 6. There should be no interruption in the movie schedule. However, as of Tuesday, the movie to be shown that weekend is not known. Look for more information next week.
