# Lady Cougars play in sub-state finals

The Lady Cougars were involved in sub-state basketball play the week of Feb. 28. They defeated Palco 55-35 in a 1A Diday, March 3. As this is a single eliminate tournament, the win moved the Lady Cougars into the next round of play.

On Saturday in the championship game they were defeated by Logan in a tight game 47-43. This means that Logan will represented the Palco Sub state in the state competition. Cheylin had an overall record of 9-13.

"I am proud of our girls and all they accomplished this season," Coach Greg Jones said. "Their dedication and strong work ethic led to a shot at becoming sub-state champions.

Leading the scoring for the Lady Cougars this year was Busse with 334. Also having over 100 points were Carmi-163, Burr with 151 and Jones six of the steals.

Busse had 217 rebounds, 23 P blocks and 61 steals for the season and was the leader in each of these categories.

Meeting canceled






